The Danville Art League's sack lunch fund-raiser on Aug. 21 and 22 raised about \$550 for the building fund.

The Rev. Dave Garver came up with the idea of delivering sack lunches to busy teachers as they return to their classrooms to prepare for the start of the new school year.

The fund-raiser received 120 orders from individuals, organizations and schools, including Danville High School, Southview Middle School, Southwest School and Sunset Funeral Home.

On each sack, they stapled a small flyer advertising the Art League's upcoming wine-tasting fund-raiser. Then various volunteers headed out to make deliveries.
