

# Openings remain for summer art camp

DANVILLE — The name of a Danville Art League summer camp for children says it all for what sounds like a fun way to spend part of a summer vacation.

The “Wet and Wild” Summer Camp will take place the week of July 13 and include lessons on art basics and projects with paint, clay, plaster sculptures and more.

“It could get messy and wild,” said art league vice president Trudy Wyatt.

The camp will be inside the art league’s studio, 502 Sherman St., and under a tent in the yard.

The camp is a different format than the June and August Saturday morning

classes.

The camp will have three teachers during the week who have all worked with children before. The participants will be divided into smaller groups which will rotate through different stations.

Carol Garver is the head teacher.

Wyatt said the youths will get three times the art exposure in each morning session.

“They will have some art instruction and time to do projects,” she added.

The maximum number of children that can sign up is 30. There are a few openings left.

“We want it to be a good experience,” Wyatt said.

The children don’t have to bring any supplies.

Wyatt said openings also

remain for the August art class series, which can accept 12.

Wyatt and Eileen Dunavan, who teaches art classes at the league’s studio, are excited about the possibilities of having classes after school and year round if the league moves into the former American Red Cross building.

The Danville Art League’s “Wet and Wild” summer camp will be from 9 a.m. to noon July 13-17. The fee is \$50 for the week. Openings remain. The August art classes are from 9-11 a.m. Aug. 1, 8, 15 and 22. The fee is \$40 for the series. The camp and classes are for students in first grade to eighth grade (ages 6-14).
